



What is the 16-19 Tuition Fund?

The 16-19 tuition fund is a one-off funding allocation for 21-22 academic year. The fund is being provided to support learners to catch up and close any gaps in their learning that may have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 lockdown. The fund will be used for small group and 1:1 tuition in for 16 to 19-year-old learners. This tuition will be in addition to the planned study programme hours.

Who can be supported by this fund?

Learners must be aged 16-19 and classed as disadvantaged and/or with SEND.

How is LAE Tottenham using this Fund?

Tuition groups will comprise of up to five students and the tuition sessions will be scheduled in addition to the planned programme of study hours already timetabled for the academic year 2021-22. Tuition sessions will be delivered face to face.

Examples of some of the Tuition Support on offer will include:

- Subject specific support for Y12 and Y13 students who are at risk of falling behind academically
- Subject specific support for Y12 and Y13 students who would benefit from further academic challenge
- Academic skills support and development, including study skills
- Specialist Support to improve engagement for learners with SEND

Tuition Support offered will be based on an individual need's assessment, the identification of an individual starting point, clear learning goals, expectations and outcomes.

What is our pledge?

The School is committed to ensuring the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance on the 16 to 19 tuition fund by:

- Producing this statement setting out how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students
- Publishing this guidance on the College website
- Recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who receive support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered and retain the evidence of the tuition provided and demonstrate the impact of the support provided
- Delivering the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2021/22
- Notify the Education Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) of any underspend from the Fund for it to be reclaimed
