Introduction



London Academy of Excellence Tottenham is an academically selective 16-19 free school opened in 2017. The school has grown from 109 students in its first year to 697 in 2023-24 (against a current published admission number of 700).

LAET is one of the highest performing schools in the country, rated outstanding in all areas by Ofsted and prioritising disadvantaged and local students in its admissions policy.

Two building projects have taken place since 2017, creating additional space for our A Level curriculum.

We are proposing an increase in PAN to 800.

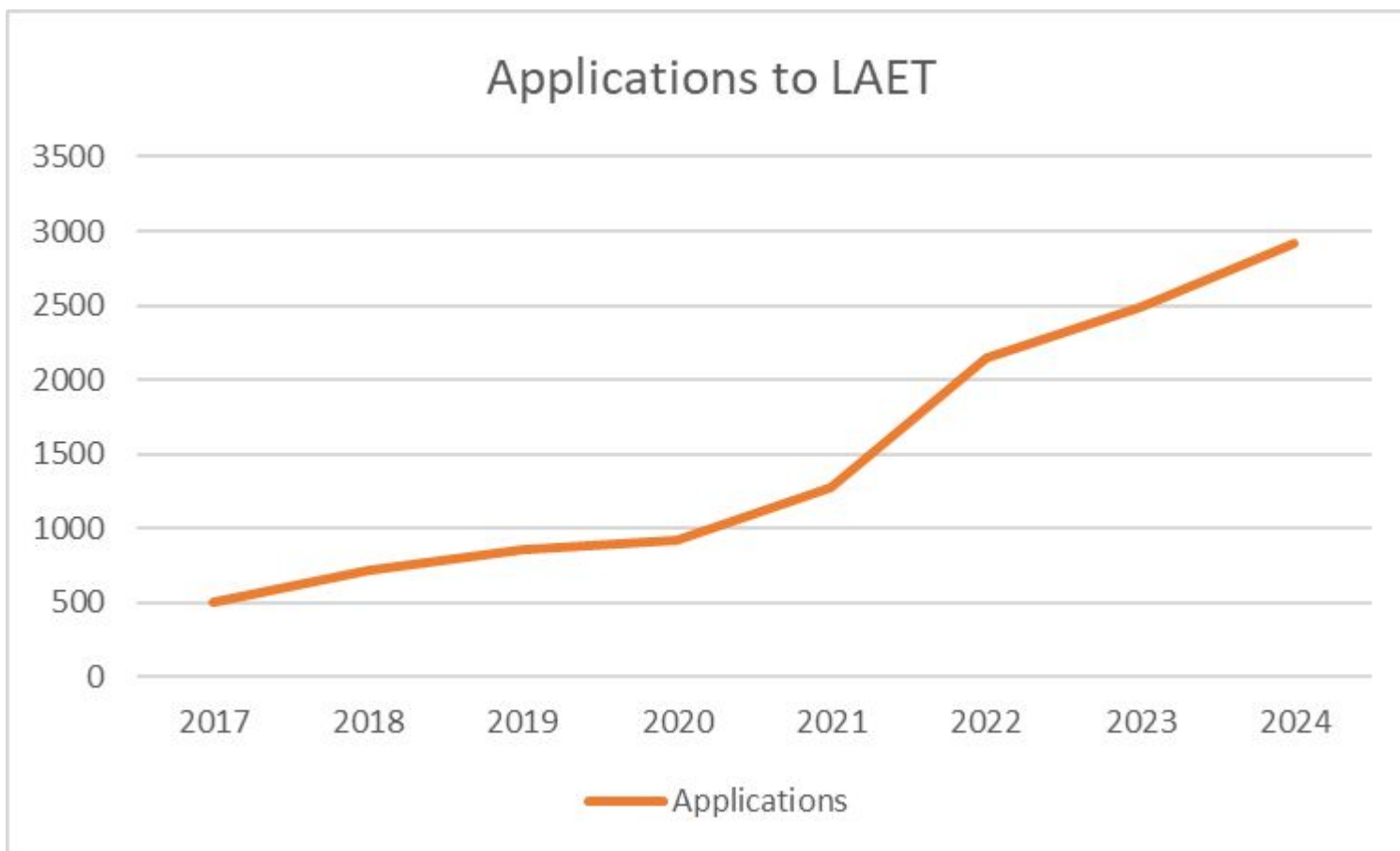
Current admissions



- There are currently 697 students on roll, against a PAN of 700.
 - We received 2916 applications for study in 2024-25 by the February deadline and have made over 1200 offers to study.
 - The admissions policy prioritises students in the following order:
 - 1) LAE Tottenham will give highest priority to applications from children who are or were in public care and who meet the admissions requirements (Looked After Children as defined by section 22 (1) of the Children's Act 1989).
 - 2) Applicants currently studying in East Haringey schools (Duke's Aldridge Academy, Gladesmore Community School, Heartlands, High School, Park View School and Mulberry Woodside Academy).
 - 3) Students who have been eligible for the pupil premium at secondary school.

Attainment

- Attainment - nationally ranked 342 out of 2700.
- Attainment (disadvantaged pupils) - nationally ranked 102 out of 2700.

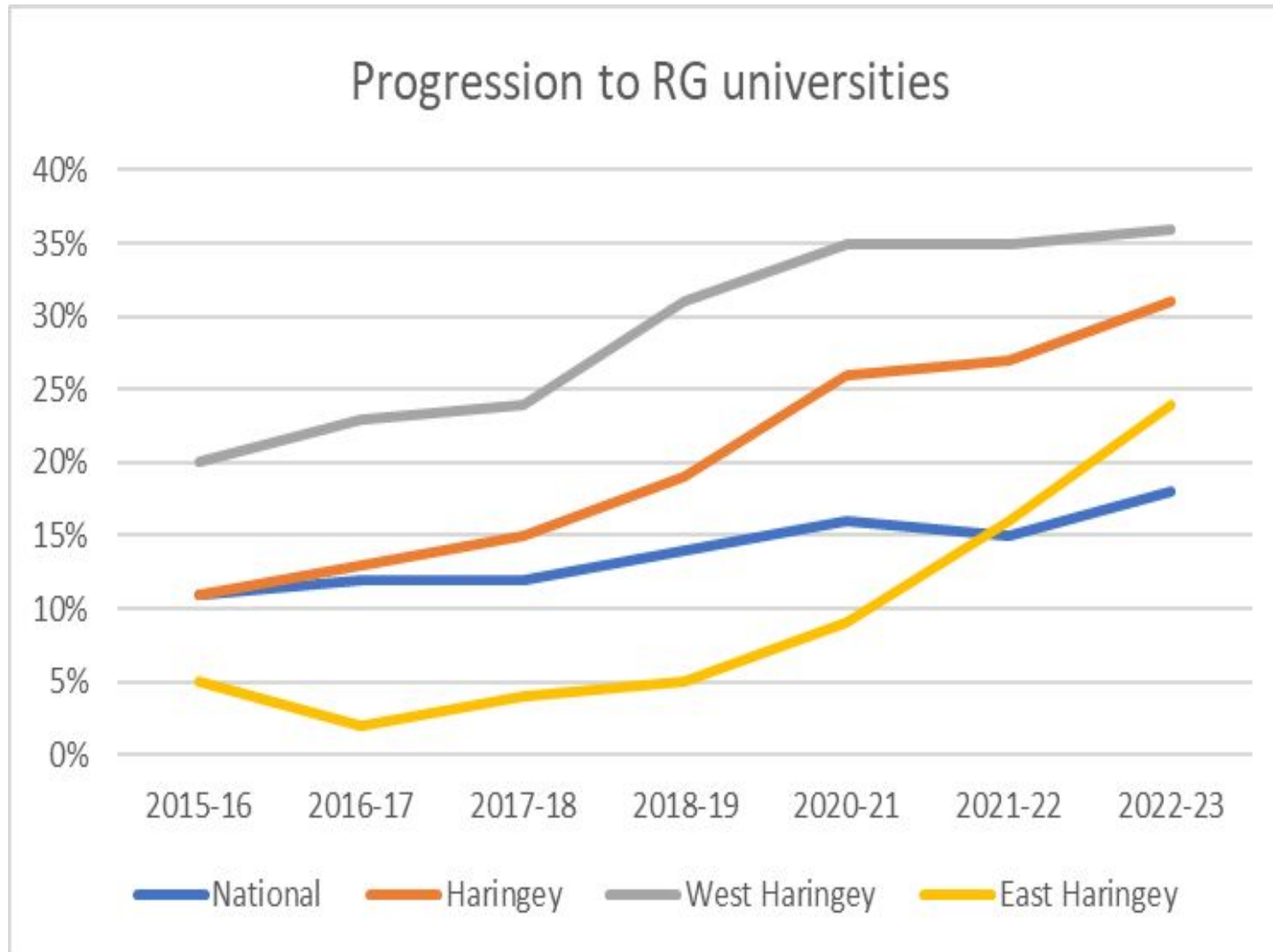
Destinations

- Destinations (top 1/3 university) - 71%, nationally ranked 38 out of 2238.
- Destinations (RG university) - 66%, nationally ranked 40 out of 2238.
- Destinations (Oxbridge) - 7%, nationally ranked 40 out of 2238.

Impact on the borough: progression to Russell Group universities



- Destinations for LAET students are first reflected in 2021-22 (for 2019 leavers).
- Russell group progression for East Haringey students has increased from 9% in 2020-21 to 24% in 2022-23.
- 74% of students studying at an East Haringey school and going to a Russell Group university, study at LAET.



What are the advantages?



- More students can benefit from an LAET education and gain their first choice of 6th form.
- There is no change to the experience for students as the building has already been converted to hold up to 800 students.
- Our curriculum offer, class sizes and co-curricular offer remain unchanged.
- A greater number of students can progress to competitive universities and employment routes.
